This year we have decided to involve everyone in the guild by doing a **bed turning** using guild member's quilts. If you would like to share your quilt(s), we will need a paragraph about the quilt. These will be put together, the quilts stacked in the proper order and then shown. We thought it would be a more personal approach and the visitors to the show seem to enjoy the bed turning.

We would appreciate any men/boys that would be able to help with set up and take down. We will also need two pickup trucks, besides Madeline's.

It is time to be finishing up your quilts, especially if you need to take it somewhere to be quilted. The mini's for the breast cancer auction can be turned into Linda Tansil at any time.

If you have any questions, please contact Madeline or any of the above committee chairs.

Editor's Note: Your contribution to the mini quilt auction can be an orphan block that you that you add a border(s) and quilt, or some other small item. Last year we had some purses, and pillowcases, for example.

Raspberry Spread

2 Cups (16 oz.) Real Mayonnaise (jar size is actually 15 oz.)
2 Cups Regular Shredded Mozzarella
2 Cups Regular Shredded Mild Cheddar Cheese
1 Bunch Green Onions chopped fine (I use about 2/3's of the bunch)
1 Small Bag Crushed Pecans
1 Small Jar Seedless Red Raspberry Jam (I use Smucker's)
Your favorite Crackers

Combine mayo, cheeses, and green onions.

Place crushed pecans in the bottom of a pie plate and then put the cheese mixture on top of the pecans. Let that set overnight in the refrigerator.

Put a plate on the top of the pie plate and invert it for the mixture to come out onto the plate and then spread the jam on top of the nuts. It does come out of the pie plate very easily--no cooking spray needed. Obviously this is not lowfat/low calorie but is delicious.
