On October 10, 2011, the River Heritage Quilt Guild meeting was called to order by Vice President Sally Miller at the Cape Girardeau Public Library with 55 members and 3 guests present.

October birthdays: Cheral Benthall, Carla Wren, Merle Deneke, Mary Kay Reed, Nola Koch, and Judy Peetz

Sally Miller read a card of **thanks** from the Glenn House for the quilts donated for their open house. Lynnore Meyer asked members for suggestions (speakers, programs, etc.) for future meetings.

Last newsletter will be this November if no one volunteers to take over this position from Linda Tansil. The person will be responsible for putting the newsletter together, posting it, and/ or mailing it. Computers skills would be helpful.

Block of the Month: Joan Meyer reported Rebecca Webb is responsible for the blocks until December and they should be on the Guild's website. Rebecca was absent. Raven Simms showed her blocks.

Mary made a request to give the KC Hall a \$50 donation for the use of their facilities for the workshop. A motion for this request made by Priscilla Kirby and seconded by Nola Koch was approved by the Guild.

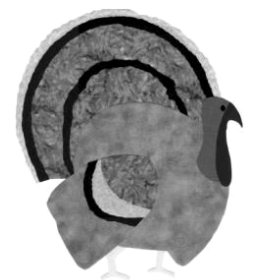

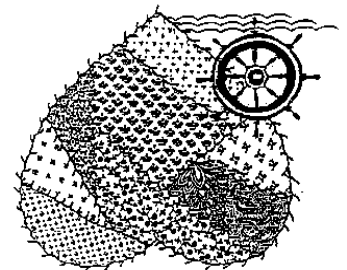
