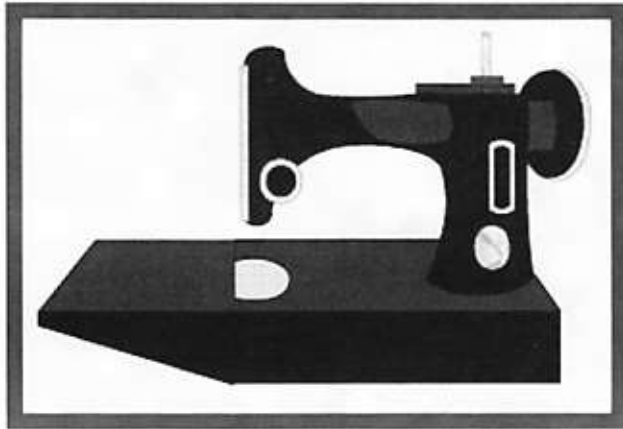


# Featherweight Mug Rug

## Materials needed for 1 mug rug:

- 2 – 6 x 9 for front and back
- 1 – 6 x 9 batting , flannel or interfacing
- 32 inches of ½ inch binding
- Assorted scraps

## Placemat cutting instructions:

Here is a quick and easy project to brighten up your desk. There are many different ways to go about making this, but everyone will start off by tracing and cutting the appliqué patches out. After cutting your patches refer to the layout diagram and iron or pin them in place. Make sure you leave plenty of room between the patches and the edge of your fabric...you wouldn't want your binding to cover anything up. Now appliqué the patches into place.

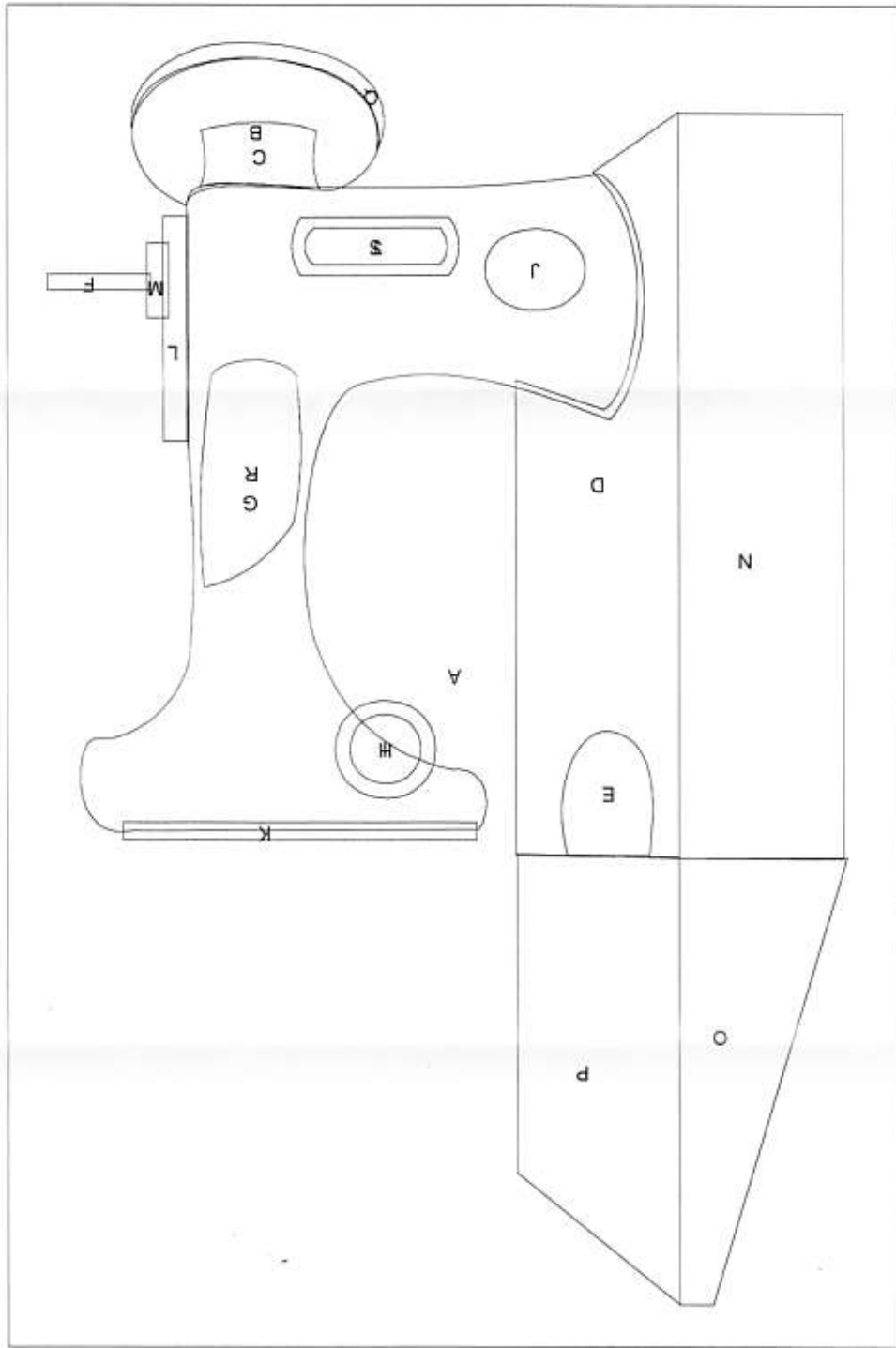
Now...I like FLAT mug rugs, so I would choose to use flannel or interfacing as my batting material. Go with what you like best and sandwich your rug together. Quilt the rug in your preferred manner. Once you have finished that iron it flat, then square up your edges. You want your finished size to be 6 x 9. Ugh...time for the binding. I detest putting on bindings ☺ Make your own or use store bought, you want ¼ inch to come over the top onto the front. That's one done! Now just make enough for all your friends!

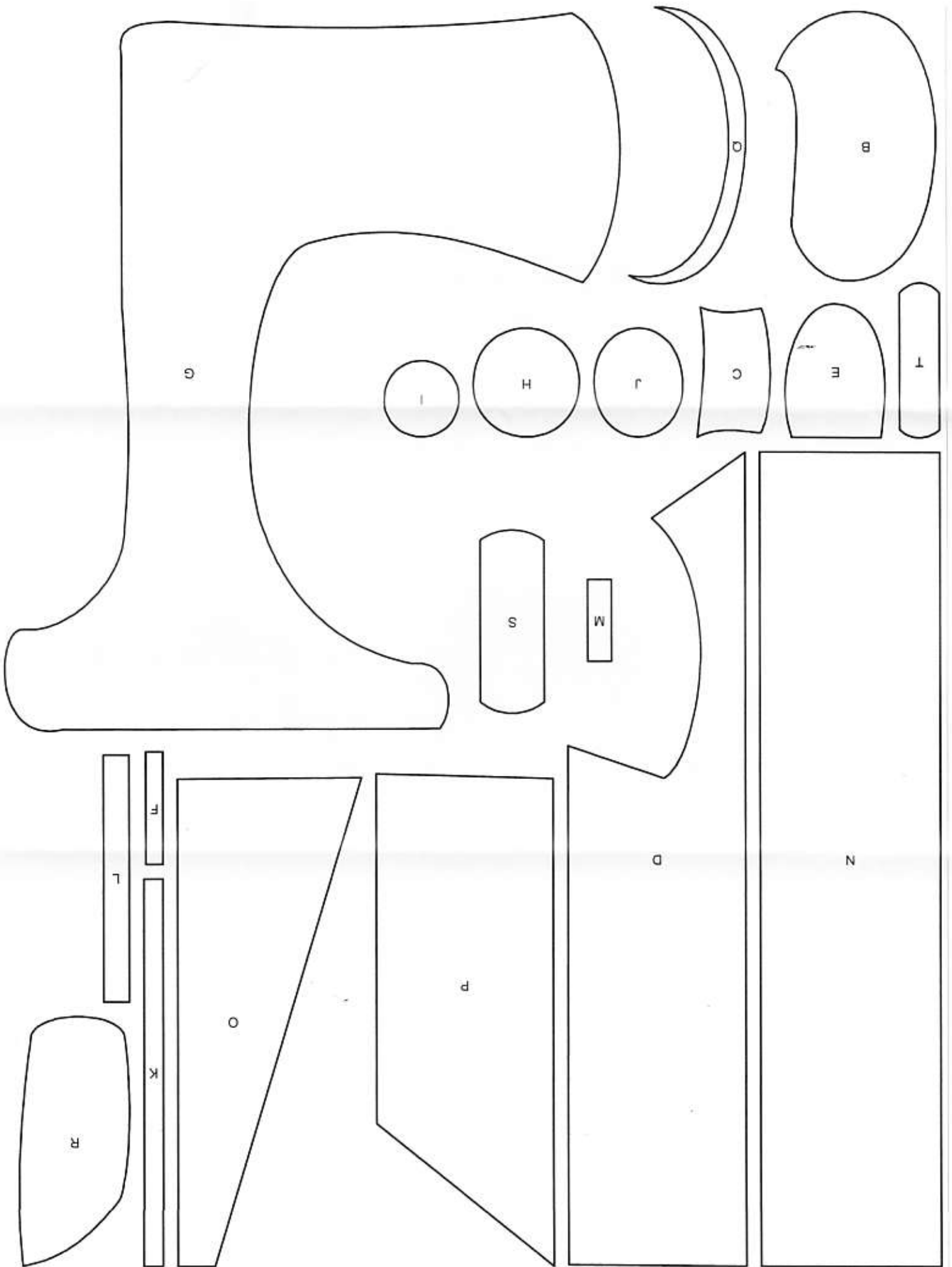
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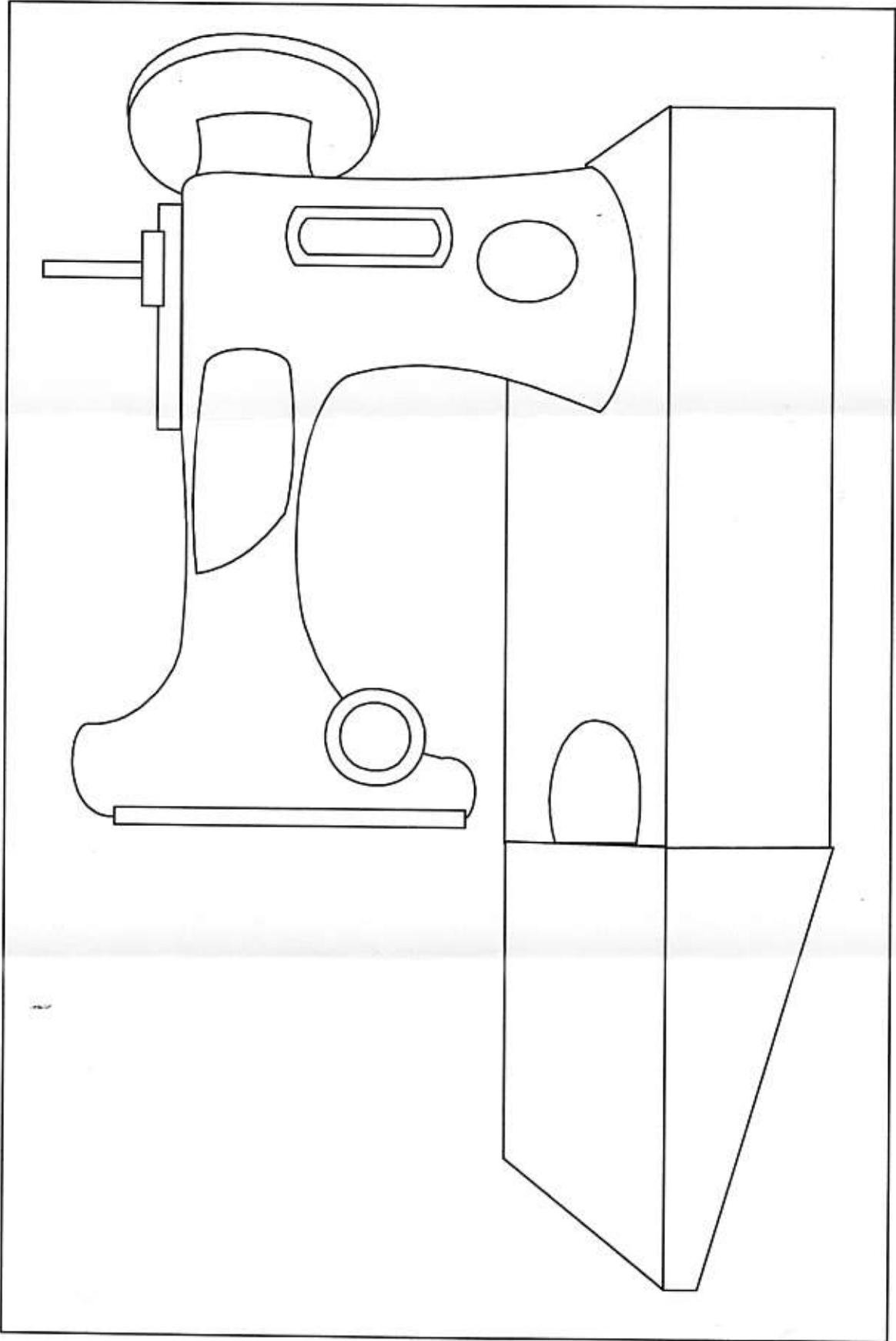
